

SEARCH CONTINUES: Jackson police need help in locating an elderly man missing since Jan. 26, when he walked away from a personal care home.

Walter Sparkman, 67, suffers from Alzheimer's disease, police detective Azel Smith said.

Smith said a staffer at Ann's Personal Care Home, 3137 James Hill St., reported that Sparkman "was sitting in a chair outside. When she turned around he was gone."

Smith said she has searched numerous locations for Sparkman, but no one has reported seeing him.

Sparkman was last seen wearing a red jacket with "Ann's" on it, a white striped shirt, brown pants and tennis shoes. He reportedly was carrying no money or identification when he left the personal care home, Smith said.

"I have been to all types of places searching for him," Smith said. "No one has seen him."

Sparkman is a black male, described to be 6 feet 2 inches tall and 150 pounds. Sparkman answers by the nickname "Bud."
