Pike County's oldest, coldest case revolves around Jeanette Williams, an 18-year-old who walked away from her mother's home on her way to church in 1990 and was never heard from again.

According to reports, though there are not many, Williams left her home just south of McComb in the Chatawa community on November 15, 1990.

Williams left her mother watching her two young sons and headed down Old U.S. 51. At the time, she was supposed to be going to meet a friend for church service at the Sunshine Mountain Home for Handicapped People.

It was only two miles, the stretch that Williams walked on the day she seemingly evaporated into thin air. She never made it to the church service and has not been seen or heard from since.

Jeanette had light brown hair and brown eyes. She was 5'2" tall at the time of her disappearance, and 102 lbs. She has crooked or fused front teeth and thick-lensed glasses. She is legally blind.

Jeanette Williams remains missing at this time and her case is unsolved. She is not listed on the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System, or NAMUS, and there is almost nothing in newspaper archives on Newspapers.com about her disappearance.
