

Infant's Body Found In Creek

An infant's body, which officials said was that of a white girl born five months prematurely was found floating in Town Creek south of Maple street Wednesday.

Detective Lt. J. P. Shipp said a coronor's jury ruled death due to a mis-carriage.

A doctor who examined the body told police that in his opinion the baby was born in mis-carriage with the mother being between three and a half to four months pregnant.

The body was found in four inches of water wrapped in a bundle of newspapers six feet south of Maple street by two passers-by.

Due to the condition of the body, officials believe the baby was thrown into the creek sometime Wednesday.
